

In doing so, the Trustees and I would urge everyone to continue to take all precautions necessary against covid-19 and also to be mindful of the fact that within our community of 150 residents, we have differing feelings about the return to independent life – some residents could not wait to get out and about again but others are more cautious and we all need to be aware and tolerant of others who may not be feeling the same as we do.

I am delighted to let you all know that we will have a new member of staff joining The Richmond Charities team. I have appointed Genevieve (Gennie) Thompson as a new Deputy Scheme Manager and she will take up her new post at the end of September.

In the next edition of the Almshouse News, I will ask Gennie to write a piece to introduce herself to you. Although she doesn't start officially until late September, Gennie and her partner Marco Bennett will be moving into the Nurse's Lodge at Hickey's in mid-August, so residents (and particularly those at Hickey's) will start to see them both around, though they are also going to do some visits to family before Gennie starts her new job. I know that you will all give them both a warm welcome.

Another change on the horizon is that Linda Prendergast, who has been a Scheme Manager for 20 years with us, will be moving from her current accommodation at Queen Elizabeth's Almshouses to live on site in our new almshouses in Twickenham.

Linda will remain as one of our Scheme Managers but there will be some small changes from September to the allocation of which Scheme Managers are responsible for which estates. More about this in the next edition.

Our new almshouses in Twickenham will be named Wright's Almshouses.
The Council asked us to come up with a name that is both unique to the area and preferably with some historical connection

to the site. Sir George Wright was the founder of our very first almshouses (Queen Elizabeth's) in 1600 and is the only one of our original benefactors that does not have his name immortalised in the name of an almshouse estate.

In the coming weeks, we will be starting to think about putting plans in place to safely re-open our guest rooms and we will also soon be starting to charge again for the use of our communal laundries. Again, more about this in the next edition.

I was glad today to see freedom in the swallows flight as they dipped and dived across the lake enjoying the morning light. And I thanked God our creator for this uplifting sight.



Telephone Scams

The following tips are recommended by the **ageuk** website as they recognise the persistent ways of phone scams.

Hang up. If you feel harassed or intimidated, or if the caller talks over you without giving you a chance to speak, end the call.

Ring the organisation. If you're unsure whether the caller is genuine, you can always ring the company or bank they claim to be from.

Don't be rushed. Scammers will try to rush you into providing your personal details. They may say they have time-limited offer or claim your bank account is at risk if you don't give them the information they need right away.



When you are on the phone remember the following:

*The bank will not ask you for your PIN number or password if they contact you. NEVER give them out.

*If the bank wants to talk to you urgently they will make an appointment for you at the branch. Don't arrange a meeting anywhere else.

*Your tax is very simple and all up to date. The Inland Revenue has no need to call you. If they call you ask them to write to you.

*You don't enter competitions so you can't have won anything. Tell the person politely that they must have the wrong number.

*In a real emergency the police would come to the house and show you ID. They won't call you.

*Don't arrange to meet anyone anywhere you don't know.

IF IN DOUBT PUT THE PHONE DOWN AND CALL YOUR NEXT OF KIN OR SCHEME MANAGER.

Opening hours:

Mon - Sat: 8am - 4pm Sunday: 9am - 4pm

Also note:

- -You will be required to stay 2 metres away from all other members of the public and staff.
- -You are advised to wear gloves for your own protection.
- -A maximum of two adults will be permitted to leave the car.
- -Staff will not be permitted to help wth heavy items.
- -Those on the NHS shielded list who are considered extremely medically vulnerable should also not visit.

Mango Salad with Thai Dressing

Ingredients:

Dressing

Juice of 2 limes

- 1 tbsp Tamari soy sauce
- 1 tsp toasted sesame oil
- 1 tbsp Xylitol sugar alternative
- (available as Total Sweet)
- 1 tsp finely grated ginger

Salad

Bag of mixed salad greens
Half small cucumber thinly sliced
1 ripe mango, peeled and cubed
Half red onion thinly sliced
Small handful of mint leaves chopped
Toasted cashew nuts (optional for added texture)

Method

Whisk all the ingredients for the dressing together in a small jug
Scatter the salad leaves on a platter. Top with the remaining ingredients
Drizzle with the dressing just before serving

Note:

This dressing can be used with noodles or wilted Pak Choy

H W Longfellow (1807 – 1882), the American poet, was an immensely popular poet in his own life time and was widely read.

His rather sentimental Victorian style seems to have gone out of fashion nowadays. But his long tone poem, The Song of Hiawatha, still has a bit of a following (I count myself as one of the followers), even if, unfortunately, it is all too easily parodied!

This little poem, simple as it is, could only have been written by a true poetic craftsman.

Note how the three short verses are linked into one whole by the subtle rhyming structure. Maybe the wheel of fortune will revolve - or, in the language of the poem, the tide will turn – and Longfellow will come back into fashion?

Loss and Gain

When I compare

What I have lost with what I have gained,

What I have missed with what attained,

Little room do I find for pride.

I am aware

How many days have been idly spent;

How like an arrow the good intent

Has fallen short or been turned aside.

But who shall dare

Defeat may be victory in disguise;

The lowest ebb is the turn of the tide.
